

Excellent learning and teaching —**what does it look like?**

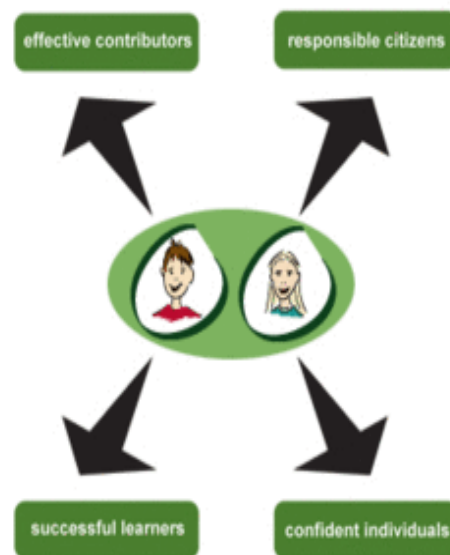
Excellent learning and teaching takes many different forms, however some features will **always** be present:

- strong, mutually respectful relationships between teacher and learners;
- well planned learning with clear learning intentions and success criteria;
- learning needs of all being met;
- safe, well organised learning environment;
- active learning in which all learners are involved and have a voice;
- awareness and understanding of prior learning;
- assessment as part of learning;
- development of higher order thinking skills; and
- development of literacy, numeracy and health & wellbeing

Leading to all pupils making appropriate progress.

Other features will **often** be present:

- use of digital technologies to support and enhance learning;
- group work/cooperative and collaborative learning;
- development of creativity skills; and
- dialogue between teacher and learner about learning, progress and next steps.

Roles and Responsibilities

Every member of our school community plays an important role in delivering **inspirational and empowering teaching** which promotes **excellent and aspirational learning** for all pupils.

Pupil Role

As a pupil at Lockerbie Academy, you are entitled to experience high quality teaching. Your role is to take advantage of that high quality teaching and turn it into high quality learning. To be ready to learn, we expect you to:

1. be prepared and on time;
2. actively participate in class lessons;
3. stay up-to-date on Teams;
4. be aware of learning intentions and success criteria;
5. be able to work on your own and avoid distractions;
6. work with others and be a valuable member of groups and teams;
7. try things before asking for help;
8. accept failure without giving up and retry when necessary;
9. use feedback to improve your work and make it the best it can be;
10. consolidate your learning with homework and independent study;
11. be aware of and talk about your own progress and next steps in learning; and
12. transfer skills between areas of learning.

Parent / Carer Role

As parents and carers of pupils at Lockerbie Academy, you play a crucial role in ensuring that pupils benefit fully from the learning and teaching provided. If we work together, we can raise the attainment, achievement and life chances of all our young people. We expect you to:

1. communicate and work with the school in a positive way in order to support the learning and development of pupils;
2. provide a home environment where learning both in and out of school is valued and expectations are high;
3. support your child / children by taking an interest in their learning:
 - ask questions and create opportunities to discuss learning and other aspects of their school life
 - monitor the pupil planner
 - attend parents' evenings and other school events;

5. provide school uniform and basic equipment as per school guidelines.
